Summit Learning Objectives

- Recognize trauma as a public health concern by increasing awareness of trauma's impact on the emotional and physical well-being of Ohioans.
- Recognize the impact of trauma on special populations and delivering trauma-informed approaches to special populations.
- Promote Trauma-informed care principles that are:
 - Based on a public health model
 - Culturally and intellectually sensitive
 - Developmentally appropriate
- Support of regional or cross-system collaboration regarding trauma-informed care and based upon sound data.
- Enhance community based capacity to deliver trauma-informed evidence-based practices.
- Support communities in developing comprehensive workforce investment strategies.
- Support trauma-informed care and policies that are driven by outcomes.
- Showcase Ohio agencies and organizations that have become trauma-informed.

- Knowledge of research and evidence-based trauma approaches.
- Organization change necessary to become trauma-informed.
- Networking and coordination across multiple systems as necessary for the delivery of effective evidence-based strategies and as key to trauma-informed approaches at the county and community level.
- The impact of trauma on special populations and the delivery of trauma-informed approaches to special populations.

- Resumes/bios of each presenter must be included when the proposal is submitted
