

## MACSIS Codes for Residential & Housing Service Categories (Non-Clinical Services) with Current Living Situations

Billable Residential & Housing Categories	Definition	Examples
<b>Crisis Care</b>	Provision of short-term care to stabilize person experiencing psychiatric emergency. Offered as an alternative to inpatient psychiatric unit. Staff 24 hours' day/7 days a week. Treatment services are billed separately. <i>Billing unit – Daily</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Crisis Bed</li> <li>▪ Crisis Residential</li> </ul>
<b>Foster Care</b>	Living situations in which the (child or adult) client resides with a non-related family or person in that person's home for purpose of receiving care, supervision, assistance and accommodations. Treatment services are billed separately Licensed through State. <i>Billing unit – Daily</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Child Foster Care</li> <li>▪ Adult Foster Care</li> </ul>
<b>Residential Care (new category)</b>	Includes room and board, and personal care 24/7 if specified in license. Rules in program or service agreement attached to housing are applicable. Treatment services are billed separately. May or May not be licensed by the State. Usually agency operated and staffed; provides 24-hour supervision in active treatment oriented or structured environment. <i>Billing unit – Daily</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Adult Care Facilities</li> <li>▪ Licensed as Type I, II or III</li> <li>▪ Buckeye Boys Ranch-Comprehensive tx</li> <li>▪ Residential care facility</li> <li>▪ Residential support</li> <li>▪ ½ way house</li> <li>▪ Group home</li> <li>▪ Supervised Group Living</li> <li>▪ Lodges</li> <li>▪ Boarding Home</li> <li>▪ Rest Home</li> </ul>
<b>Respite Care</b>	Short-term living environment, it may or may not be 24-hour care. Reasons for this type of care are more environmental in nature. May provide supervision, services and accommodations. Treatment services are billed separately. <i>Billing unit – Daily</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Placement during absence of another caretaker where client usually resides</li> <li>▪ Respite Care</li> </ul>
<b>Temporary Housing (new category)</b>	Non-hospital, time limited residential program with an expected length of occupancy and goals to transition to permanent housing. Includes room and board, with referral and access to treatment services that are billed separately. Ohio tenant landlord law does NOT cover agreement. <i>Billing unit – Daily</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Commonly referred to as time limited, short term living.</li> <li>▪ Transitional Housing Programs</li> <li>▪ Homeless county residence currently receiving services</li> <li>▪ Persons waiting for housing</li> </ul>
<b>Community Residence (redefined)</b>	Person living in an apt where they entered into an agreement that is <b>NOT</b> covered by Ohio tenant landlord law. Rules in program or service agreement attached to housing. Refers to financial sponsorship and/or provision of some degree of on-site supervision for residents living in an apartment dwelling. Usually Board or agency owned. Treatment services are billed separately. <i>Billing unit – Daily or Monthly</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Service Enriched Housing</li> <li>▪ Apartments with non-clinical staff attached</li> <li>▪ SAMI housing- no alcohol on site</li> <li>▪ Supervised Apartments</li> </ul>
<b>Subsidized Housing (new category)</b>	Person living in an apt where they entered into a lease with accordance to Ohio tenant landlord law or a mortgage and, in instances where ODMH allocated funds have been used, an exit strategy for the subsidy has been developed. Treatment services are billed separately. <i>Billing unit –Daily or Monthly</i>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ Home - Ownership</li> <li>▪ HAP</li> <li>▪ Housing as Housing</li> <li>▪ Person living in rental unit subsidized by state or Board funds</li> <li>▪ Type IV –not licensed</li> </ul>
